Head Start and Early Head Start programs promote school readiness, support the mental, social, and emotional development of children from birth to age 5 years, throughout New Mexico. Under Head Start regulations, when a family receives kinship or foster care for a child, such child is considered categorically income eligible for free enrollment into the program.

New Mexico Early Childhood Education and Care Department (ECECD) — Home Visiting is a free, relationship-based program for families who are pregnant or have children under age five; home visitors see you in the convenience of your home or *via* remote telehealth sessions. The Child Care Assistance program subsidizes the cost of child care for families at or below 400% of the federal poverty level and who are working, in school, or searching for employment. The Family Nutrition Bureau ensures eligible children and adults receive nutritious meals that meet USDA meal pattern requirements.
